Rev Rene celebrating 15 years: building dreams

First published in 2000, the Journal of Northeastern Nursing Network (Rev Rene), was born of a professionals' agreement representing Polos of knowledge in the Northeast of Brazil. The journal was originated from the dream of create opportunities to disseminate the knowledge of technical and scientific work of nurses in the area⁽¹⁾. Therefore, the first editorial registered the beginning of this achievement, coordinated by one of the most prominent leaders of nursing in Brazil and, at the time, participant in one of the Polos, Professor Dr. Lorita Marlena Freitag Pagliuca, who to this day nourishes the dream to move forward with Rene.

In the first five years (2000-2004), it was published two volumes a year. From 2005 to 2007, the volumes were available each four months. Due to the growing demand for articles between 2008 and 2011, the publication took place every three months and, since 2012, it is produced a bimonthly edition. There were two additional numbers, one in 2010 and another in 2011.

Over those fifteen years, each volume had an editorial and it was released original articles, reviews, book reviews, abstracts and other documents. Only in 2013, 120 articles were published, on average, twenty articles by number.

At first, the printed mode had lily and aligned pages, printed in the university printer, wrapped in cloak with layout in mauve, purple and red tones. Depending on the requirements access, the technological advances and the commitment with sustainability, in 2013 the disclosure started to be done by digital media, available on the website www.revistarene.ufc.br, quickly reaching readers from around the globe. Still, in 2013, to expand the access to volumes and numbers, the articles published in Portuguese and the abstracts in English, Spanish and Portuguese also won the English full version.

In addition, in 2014 the Rev Rene purchased the Digital Object Identifier - Digital Document Identifier (DOI), a numerical system that can locate and access materials on the internet, especially publications in journals and copyrighted works, many of which are located in virtual libraries. A document retains its DOI throughout its existence⁽²⁾.

As a result, we recognize the importance of acquiring the DOI and celebrate this achievement, since this feature allows the articles, published in the magazine, to be more easily identified, thus increasing the possibility of citations and hence greater internationally dissemination of scientific knowledge produced by Brazilian Nursing.

As noted, the Journal, over the fifteen years, reached more than what was included as initial mission. From regional researchers, publishes work from all regions of the country, providing knowledge exchange and dissemination of professional assistance of qualified researchers and groups from different institutions.

Thus, efforts were made to cover expenses of the magazine and make it accessible. There was gratuitous at first, nowadays it is charged the submission and publishing fee. These features are unique and make it possible to fund the costs of formatting and editing.

Over the years, several projects were submitted to funding agencies, and we are optimistic that soon there will be funding to expand the possibilities of dissemination.

Therefore, it is a great success to maintain Rev Rene, for the reason that today this journal is an example

Brazilian magazines that maintain bimonthly publications without financial resources, no subsidy from funding agencies and without own employees are rare. The Rev Rene survives! It is an example of love, desire to win and union.

Even in the face of such adversity, we celebrate. Fifteen years of publication. Fifteen years of work, dedication, commitment, persistence and a lot of dreams. Many dreams!

It aims, in the coming years, to grow more, persist and achieve recognition and qualification of a reference journal.

This is a time to reflect on the thought of a great thinker, Vladimir Lenin, which translates our feelings: we must dream, but with the condition of believing in our dream, to observe carefully the real life, to confront the observation with our dream, to scrupulously realize our fantasies. Dreams: believe them.
